Blockchain

As the blockchain becomes more important we want to educate you about it. This is the fifth edition in our blockchain series. This week we will show you the second half of our interview with Andy Beal about the blockchain. Last week, we showed the first half of our interview with Andy Beal, on the third week we covered the disadvantages of using the blockchain, the second week was the advantages and the first week was an overview of the blockchain.

Mr. Beal is a blockchain expert. He started as a lawyer then moved on to be a consultant. Then he moved on to cryptocurrency and has been doing it for eight years. Andy Beal writes a weekly newsletter about blockchain. To learn more, go to <https://30000feet.substack.com/>

Here is the second part of our interview with Andy:

Q: What do you think about the security of the blockchain and wallets?

A: The distinction to be made is that if you are using an exchange like Coinbase and keeping the coins there you can't lose your key because they manage it for you and they have you memorize a password and username. That is different than keeping your key on your computer. Then you would be responsible for that key and you can't get a new one.

Q: Do you think that the advantages of the blockchain will outweigh the effects on the climate?

A: Everything requires energy like cars need gasoline and we need food. I don't think the question is how much power are you using but where is it sourced. Let's use Bitcoin as an example. About two thirds of the power that is used to support the system is unrenewable sources like coal and oil and about one third come from renewable sources. We are not going to reduce the amount of energy used but we can change where it is coming from. So, we can leverage water, sun, wind and make computers greener.

Q: How do you think the blockchain will change and evolve in the future?

A: The blockchain as the accounting system for the internet is going to get really big because it has to track a lot of things. So one they will be very big and two they will be very valuable because of that. They will have a lot of value like how tesla and apple are worth trillions of dollars well some of the biggest blockchains are already worth that. Think about it as a public company because if you own bitcoin, you are really just a shareholder in the bitcoin network. While they are like plumbing you can still own it. Like you can't own a piece of the internet because there is no way to buy it but you can buy part of the blockchain. The blockchain is going to get really big managing maybe billions of assets, they are going to get valuable. But they also need to be very fast as fast as the internet and also very private and secure. Those are big challenges that the blockchain community has to solve.

Q: Anything else that you want our readers to know?

A: This is what I would like for people to understand. That before the blockchain and the internet there was a very limited number of outlets for news there was the newspaper, the local news and a magazine. Now there are many more sources for media because there are so many sites. The reason that there are so many now is that before it was very expensive to put out information because you had to print big newspapers or you had to own a television station but now you can make sites and print easier and better. Because of the internet and that has allowed us to have similar reach to big companies before the internet. That is the equivalent to what the blockchain will do to the financial sector. Think about who provides the financial services today just banks and fintech's like PayPal. You have to give them your money and they do the things for you. They give out loan and credit cards. You will have more control and freedom over your finances and act as your own bank just how people now can manage news outlets themselves.
