One of the programs is "Start With Hello". Start With Hello is a program that helps kids that are alone and isolated from other people. Start With Hello has helped many people to be included and feel like they are important or remembered. Start With Hello has more than 7 million people participating and has helped so many people have empathy and kindness in their hearts. Start With Hello has also helped people learn to have confidence and believe in themselves and learn to help each other and build up self-esteem and speak up. Start With Hello helps people to choose kindness because if someone saw another person alone without anyone you have to choose to be kind and say hello to the person. When you choose to be kind and talk to that person, they feel included and they change and you start to build a connection. When you choose to be kind you also change, you change the way you think and you start helping others. Start With Hello has also reduced bullying and is an amazing program that is helping many people to learn many important things.

Another one of the programs is "Say Something". Say Something is a program to encourage people to speak-up when you see a person bulling another person and you don't want to get hurt or involved but you want to help. When that happens you can send a tip. The tip is where you put your school address and some adults from the Sandy Hook Promise and from the program Say Something will go to your school and figure-out the problem. In the tip you don't even have to put your name. So far Say something has gotten more than 60,000 anonymous tips.

Halloween

Since Halloween is on the 31st we want to give you some information about this fun holiday.

History

Halloween as we know it today is a mix of different celebrations from around the world. In celtic Ireland and Britian there was the festaval of Samhain. On the equivilent of November 1 they believed that the new year started. The day was their start of winter. The festival of Samhain started at sunset on October 31st and probaly lasted about three days. This time was very important because it is when land agreements would start and end and when the animals were brought in and the crops put away. During this time important trials would happen, debts would be payed back and new kings would be crowned. The Celtics believed that during this time the line between the spiritual world and the physical world was blurred. They believed that the spirits of the dead would come back. To attract welcomed spirits the Celtics would put special offereings inside their homes. But they also believed that evil spirits would also come back and harrass them. To ward of these evil spirits they would make big bonfires and leave out food. Some people would even make costumes because they didn't want the evil spirits to recognise them. This is part of the reason demons and witches are so synonymous with holloween. Over time the cultures from many other celebrations like Day of the Dead mixed with Samhain and created the holloween we know today.

Halloween today

Though Halloween has evolved the traditions we do today still have roots in ancient traditions. For exemple, trick or treat comes from the british practice of letting the needy to beg for food in a tradition called soul cakes. Jack-o-lanterns started in Ireland were they carved turnips and left them out. But the name Jack comes from a old Irish legend about a man named Stingy Jack who was doomed to roam the earth with only a hollowed turnip with him. Instead of dead animals for costumes today people wear costumes themed around their favorite characters.
