## **Black History Month**

During February America will be celebrating African-Americans' impact on America, their history and culture. In Black History month we celebrate people like Rosa Parks, Martin Luther King Jr and more. Below are some facts about some people who made a big impact on our daily life.

This week, we would like to celebrate Dr. Mae C. Jemison

She was a NASA scientist and the first african american woman in space.

- Was born October 17, 1956 in Decatur, Alabama
- She moved to Chicago at the age of three
- Her uncle first taught her about science
- She loved astronomy from an early age
- In highschool she thought she was going to be a biomedical engineer
- She got into Stanford University on a National Achivement Scholarship at the age of 16
- She served as the head of the Black Student Union
- She graduated with a Bachelor degree in chemical engineering in 1977
- After she studied in Cuba, Kenya and Thailand
- In 1981 she got her Medical Doctor degre from Cornell University in 1981 then worked as a general practitioner
- For 2.5 years she worked as the Peace Corps medical officer in Sierra Leone and Liberia
- In October of 1985 she applied to NASA astronaut training program but the Challenger disaster stopped the selection process
- When she reappliedd in 1987 she and 14 other candidates were chosen out of around 2,000 candidates
- She flew into space on September 12, 1992 on the Endeavour on mission STS47 Spacelab-even even though she is scared of heights
- She stayed in space for 8 days
- She conducted experiments on weightlessness and motion sickness on the crew
- She left NASA in 1993
- She was in a Star Trek episode

Dr. Mae Jemison has received many awards and received several honaray doctorates. In 1988 she got the Essence Science and Technology Award and in 1992 the Ebony Black Achievement Award. A school in Detroit Michigan was named after her. These are only some of her awards.

After NASA she did incredible things. She created the <u>Jemison Foundation</u> and many other impressing foundations. Right now she is running the 100 Year Starship program wich is a nonprofit that is working to get humans beyond our solar system. Dr. Mae Jemison is a very interesting and inspiring person.
